You can also earn stickers by helping after the feeding program is over, like wiping the tables and drying cups. I am usually too distracted with playing with my friends to sign up for chores plus I do plenty of those at home. I love going to the feeding program because so many of my friends from the neighborhood come and I get to meet new people too.

My soccer team continued to do very well in the league that I am in charge of. We made it to the championship game but we lost by a point. We were all bummed to lose but I always start a new league a couple of months later so we will have another chance. As much as I like to have my team win, I realize that this league is really about getting guys together to play sports, make new friends and giving young guys something fun to do with their free time that is healthy. Since coming back from the United States in January life has been really busy. With scholarship decisions and 600 some backpacks to buy supplies for plus a team that would be arriving at the end of January, I hit the ground running. However, I could never run too fast because life with three children just takes a little longer. January and February seemed to fly by though and lots of little jobs were put off until a later date. March did not seem to slow down either even though I was done paying all 51 university scholarships for their first trimesters or quarters as well as the other 48 scholarships that are for youth at vocational schools or learning English or at private schools in Managua. There was always something else to do - translating for a family who is going through the adoption process, helping pour cement one day for the pool, learning my new position as treasurer for the church that we attend on Sundays, hosting youth groups every two weeks. All of that plus the normal activities of life with a family. The best part for me, though, as a mom, is that in many of the activities that I do for the sports center and the scholarship program, my kids are often by my side and even helping out. Nicole is only 7 months old so she cannot really do much and yet taking a baby with me to the bank and other places often gets me preferential treatment. They love babies in this culture so having Nicole with me when I go pay scholarships always helps me develop relationships. Anthony is now four and is very helpful and even more so if there is some competition involved. Samantha is six and a half and loves to be with people. She knows many of the kids that are at the feeding program and that hang out in the library. She also is an amazing helper with Nicole. My kids are always at youth group nights and are often around when we have teams here. I love that they are growing up in this environment.



The pool is coming along. What looked like a large hole in the ground a couple of months ago is now starting to take shape. At the end of March we had a group of 12 guys helping with the first cement pour for the footings of the floor of the pool. We still have a ways to go, but week by week it is coming along. The community is excited about the idea of a local pool, and I know many kids will soon be learning how to swim.
