She told me how thankful she was to have had the opportunity to do this and that it allowed her to have a little bit of her own money instead of always being dependent on her husband. I see a huge need for this kind of work – giving out small loans (\$20-\$200) for small business ventures to individuals who would not be able to apply for one at a bank.
