Thank you so much for your prayers for me in getting my US citizenship. Back in July we wrote in our newsletter asking for specific prayer requests about this whole process. One was for having to come back to the States to be fingerprinted. After doing some research, we discovered that I could have them done in El Salvador which would be a lot cheaper. In September while Amanda's parents were visiting, her dad and I took a two-day road trip to El Salvador and were successful in having my fingerprints taken for my application. The second prayer request was that our interview date be given during December when we planned to be in the States. In November we received word that I would be interviewed on December 20th. I arrived in California on December 18th and two days later I was in San Francisco taking my US citizenship test. Everything went smoothly as I passed the tests and then because of our particular situation, they agreed to swear me in right then and there. So on December 20th I became a US citizen!

My work continues to go well in teaching computer classes to Pre K1 through 3rd graders. I have enjoyed having both Samantha and Anthony at the school this fall. My soccer league ended in September in which my team took third place. Then in November we started the league again with seven teams. My team has been playing really well and is undefeated so far. The other day I realized that I have had some players that have been playing with me since they were 13 years old. They are now 18 and still playing, but what is more exciting is that they have recently graduated

from high school and are looking to go to college next year. Amanda is hoping to raise enough funds in her scholarship program to be able to sponsor these young men.

What a year this has been! A new beautiful, healthy baby. Thomas receiving US citizenship. Seven university students in the scholarship program graduating with their degrees. Another fifty university students completing another year of study. Seven different short-term teams blessing the sports center and the community. And numerous individuals making a difference through prayer, hard work, service and financial giving. God continues to amaze me through His blessings to the sports center, the scholarship program and our family. Back in May we had learned that a foundation was willing to give \$16,400 as a matching gift for us to build a pool at the sports center. A group of girls from Westlake Hills Presbyterian Church had committed to help raise the rest of the funds. In September we were very excited to hear that on the Sunday when the girls spoke to their congregation about their new fundraiser, one gentleman came to them between services and told them that he would like to give the remaining \$16,400. Back in his youth he had been an outstanding competitive swimmer. While in his twenties he realized how much God had blessed him through the sport of swimming, and he made a commitment to someday return that blessing by building a pool for others to enjoy swimming too. When he heard the girls speak about their new fundraiser, he was reminded of his promise and told them between services that he wanted to fund the other \$16,400. You can probably imagine the excitement the girls must have felt when they heard this! We are also quite excited and have begun digging out the place for the pool.
